Have you heard the news?

1. Mat-Su Health Foundation's grant of nearly \$1.7 million to the Willow Library Association has us focusing, now, on matching funds from Mat-Su Borough and the State of Alaska. Public libraries in Alaska are primarily funded by public monies, and we need that to happen for the New Willow Library and Upgraded Community Center Project.

In late April, the Borough will hold an important budget hearing in Willow. We will warmly welcome the assembly members, graciously feed them, and strongly request \$1.9 million for this project. **Please plan to come**. Community support is needed to get Borough support, Borough support to get State support, and public support to get private support. Once the budget hearing date is set, we'll be publicizing it in hopes of a **BIG turnout**.

Visit the Talkeetna and Sutton libraries if you've not yet done so. Our tax dollars have helped provide up-to-date libraries and community centers elsewhere, and now we want the same for Willow. Thanks for helping in any way you are able, one of which is to simply **show up for the April budget hearing**.
