<u>Statewide Tax Comparisons</u>: As a follow-up to the February 16 Assembly Special Meeting on School Funding, a question was asked about how Mat-Su taxes compare to other municipalities in Alaska. <u>School District Unassigned Fund Balance</u>: As a follow-up to the February 16 Assembly Special Meeting on School Funding, a question was asked about the Mat-Su Borough School District's fund balance. As of the end of fiscal year 2020, the District's ending unassigned fund balance was \$23,625,155. On average over the past five years, the District's ending unassigned fund balance has increased by approximately 20% annually.


During the meeting, it was mentioned that the District may be receiving additional COVID-19 related Federal funding from the December 2020 authorization. The District has been allocated \$15.8 million in Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief (ESSER II) funds. This funding was made available under the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations (CRRSA) Act through the State of Alaska Department of Education & Early Development. The grant funds can be used through September 30, 2023. Subject to School Board approval, funds will be utilized to address learning loss, replacing classroom technology, and supporting building and custodial needs. In addition, all charter schools will be entitled to their per pupil allocation consistent with State law. The Borough Core Leadership team comprised of MSB Purchasing Officer Russ Krafft, MSB Planning Director Alex Strawn, MSB Planning Services Manager Kim Sollien, with the support of Planning Division Administrative Specialist Leda Borys, will work to answer any questions brought forth by the Arctic Winter Games International Committee.

It is the Borough's intention to be prepared to host a virtual tour of the facilities and venues in the proposal, by the end of March.



While the bid review is taking place, preliminary work is being done with the Mat-Su Convention and Visitor Bureau, laying the framework for establishing the Host Society non-profit.

With support from the Matanuska–Susitna Borough School Board, Cook Inlet Tribal Council, Chickaloon Village Traditional Council, Greater Palmer Chamber of Commerce, Greater Wasilla Chamber of Commerce, City of Palmer, City of Wasilla, Mat-Su Convention & Visitors Bureau, Mat-Su Ski Club, Skeetawk Ski Hill, Glenn Massay Theater, Premier Alaska Tours and CurlAK we are already seeing strong support and a rising tide of interest in the games.

Vaccination Weekly Update: Last week at the Fairgrounds there were 1,529 vaccines administered.

Currently the following phases are open for vaccinations:

- Phase 1a, all Tiers
  - $\circ$   $\$  People 65 and above regardless of health issues
- Phase 1b Tier 2
  - Ages 50 and over, with high risk medical conditions, cancer, heart disease, diabetes, etc.
  - Education Staff regardless of age, K-12<sup>th</sup> grades, child care workers and support staff, indigenous language and cultural bearers
  - Limited pandemic response staff

- Frontline essential workers aged 50 and over who work within 6 feet of others (Fire, EMS, Law Enforcement, Food Workers, Transportation Workers)
- People living or working in congregate settings like jails, API, group homes, homeless and domestic violence shelters, substance treatment facilities, transitional living homes
