<u>FireWise Community Outreach on May 8, 2021</u>: The event was attended by approximately 400 people, which allowed for great interaction and education with the public. People enjoyed the presentations and seemed appreciative that the departments were holding the learning events. Several FireWise survey contacts were made for follow up visits to occur. This event also doubled as a great recruitment opportunity.

  - Staff presented at two community meetings held for the Lynx Lake fuels reduction project where FireWise surveys, emergency communications and evacuation alerting were discussed
- Staff have contacted nine interested homeowners and are working on scheduling six others for survey visits; three FireWise surveys have been completed
- Rough draft of Community Wildfire Protection Plans (CWPP) update is in place
  - Our CWPP planner will be working on CWPP updates
  - o Community Council visits will be scheduled to educate and coordinate CWPPs
- Spruce Bark Beetle grant is being reviewed and updated, currently in review by Department of Forestry

The timeline for public input, public hearing schedules, and ballot placement:


- Transportation Advisory Board week of June 11, 2021
- Large RSA Advisory Board June 17, 2021
- Planning Commission Intro June 7, 2021 and Public Hearing June 21, 2021
- Assembly Special Meeting June 22, 2021 to review/discuss package
- Assembly Intro July 20, 2021 and Public Hearing August 3, 2021
- Outreach to Public Outreach community councils, home builders, business owners, and general public June 22, 2021 or sooner if the draft package is ready through August 3, 2021
- Deadline for the Fall ballot is August 27, 2021

<u>Vaccination Weekly Update</u>: The State vaccination page has updated; it seems low, but it could be that people chose to enjoy their long weekend rather than spend it getting vaccinated. This will be the last week vaccinations are reported in the Weekly Post as there are not significant changes in the numbers from week to week and this information is already available publicly via the State website.

The State is reporting, for residents 12+: 52% have 1+ dose, 46% are fully vaccinated. For 65+: 73% have 1+ dose and 69% are fully vaccinated.

For Mat-Su Borough, residents 12+: 36% have 1+ dose, 31% are fully vaccinated. For 65+: 59% have 1+ dose and 56% are fully vaccinated.

On the list of boroughs/census areas by 1+ dose in residents 12+, we are still above Southeast Fairbanks Census Area (30%) and North Slope Borough (34%).
