PUBLIC PARTICIPATION NEEDED TO DETERMINE WHAT THE COMMUNITY NEEDS ARE FOR SPENDING OPIOID SETTLEMENT FUNDS IN THE MAT-SU BOROUGH

Opioid Lawsuit and Settlements: The opioid epidemic has affected many lives in Alaska and across the nation. In 2021 alone there were 160 deaths in Alaska from opioid overdoses; across our nation there were 106,699 opioid overdose deaths that year. The severe impact of the epidemic compelled many states to sue several distributors, manufacturers, and pharmacies involved in distributing prescription opioids. Settlements were reached in most lawsuits and settlement funds are being distributed to States and Municipalities across America to help remediate the effects of the opioid epidemic. The funds must be spent on opioid remediation.

As a result of the settlement, the Mat-Su Borough (Borough) anticipates receiving multi-year payments from litigants totaling approximately \$2.3 Million over an 18 year period.

Opioid Remediation: means community actions involved in any of the four following areas relating to the opioid epidemic: <u>Primary Prevention</u>, <u>Harm Reduction</u>, <u>Treatment</u>, and <u>Recovery</u>.

Needs Assessment in the Borough: Our task is to determine what the greatest needs are for opioid remediation in the Borough and we need public input to do that. This effort will consist of three public-participation meetings, a public survey and a committee of experts participating in the public meetings to help prioritize the Borough's needs. Those results will be presented to the Borough Assembly for consideration/approval for how to spend the funds.

When the needs assessment is complete, the Borough will advertise the Assembly-approved list of needs and seek applications from qualifying Mat-Su organizations for potential grants.

The Borough will receive and vet the applications and disperse the grants. The recipient organizations will be required to follow up with reports on how they spent the funds and the resulting outcomes (if quantifiable).
