AN ORDINANCE OF THE MATANUSKA-SUSITNA BOROUGH ASSEMBLY ADOPTING MSB 5.25.150 WILLOW-CASWELL FIRE SERVICE AREA TO CONSOLIDATE THE WILLOW FIRE SERVICE AREA AND THE CASWELL FIRE SERVICE AREA AND SUBMITTING THE QUESTION TO THE QUALIFIED VOTERS AT THE NOVEMBER 5, 2024, REGULAR BOROUGH ELECTION.

WHEREAS, the intent, rationale, and supporting information for this ordinance is found in Information Memorandum No. 24-126 and Resolution Serial No. 24-068.

BE IT ENACTED:

Section 1. Classification. Sections 2 and 3 of this ordinance are of a general and permanent nature and shall become a part of the Borough Code. All other sections are noncode.

Section 2. Repeal of Code.

MSB 5.25.059 and MSB 5.25.144 are repealed in their entirety.

Section 3. Adoption of Code.

(B) *Services.* The services to be provided in this
service area are all things necessary and proper to
provide fire protection.

(C) *Board of Supervisors.* The Willow-Caswell Fire
Service Area No. 140 Board of Supervisors shall consist of
a three-member board that shall operate pursuant to

MSB 5.15.010. The three-year term shall be calculated on a calendar-year basis.

Section 4. Public Interest and Recommendation. The public interest is served through the inclusion of the properties described in Section 3 and shown on the map attached to IM No. 24-126, into the unified Willow-Caswell Fire Service Area No. 14 0 and does not require circulation of a petition among resident in the proposed area pursuant to MSB 5.10.015. Based on the report and recommendation of the Manager included in IM No. 24-126, as prepared by the Borough Manager, such action is feasible and practicable to provide fire protection services to the citizens with the proposed area.

Section 5. Ballot proposition. A proposition in substantially the following form shall be placed on ballot at the November 5, 2024, regular Borough election and be submitted to the qualified voters who reside in the existing Willow Fire Service Area No. 35 and the existing Caswell Fire Service Area No. 135. A description and map will be made available to voters at the polling place.

CONSOLIDATION OF THE WILLOW FIRE SERVICE AREA AND THE CASWELL FIRE SERVICE AREA INTO A NEW WILLOW-CASWELL FIRE SERVICE AREA.

Shall properties that presently comprise the Willow Fire Service Area and Caswell Fire Service Area be consolidated into a

single Willow-Caswell Fire Service Area? The services to be provided in the consolidated Willow-Caswell Fire Service Area are all things necessary and proper to provide for fire protection.

The anticipated cost of services within the consolidated Willow-Caswell Fire Service Area the first year is approximately 2.637 mills or \$263.70 per \$100,000 of assessed valuation.

Section 6. Tabulation of votes.

The proposition contained in Section 5 of this ordinance will be tabulated separately for each of the existing fire service areas.

Section 7. Effective date.

Sections 1, 4, 5 and 6 of this ordinance take effect immediately. Sections 2 and 3 of this ordinance take effect on July 1, 2025, only if the proposition contained in section 5 of this ordinance is approved, separately, by a majority of voters who vote on the question and who reside in each of the service areas.

A RESOLUTION OF THE MATANUSKA-SUSITNA BOROUGH ASSEMBLY FINDING THAT THE PROPOSED CONSOLIDATION OF THE WILLOW AND CASWELL FIRE SERVICE AREAS INTO A SINGLE, CONSOLIDATED WILLOW-CASWELL FIRE SERVICE AREA SERVES THE PUBLIC INTEREST AND DOES NOT REQUIRE CIRCULATION OF A PETITION AMONG THE RESIDENTS IN THE PROPOSED CONSOLIDATION AREA.

WHEREAS, the Borough Administration has been approached by the Board of Supervisors of the Willow and Caswell fire service areas regarding the creation of a consolidated fire service area; and

WHEREAS, the Assembly, through adoption of this resolution finds that the public interest will be served through consolidation of the Willow and Caswell fire service areas into a new Willow-Caswell Fire Service Area No. 140, as each existing fire service area board voted unanimously to combine the service areas in order to enhance fire protection services, achieve efficiencies, and obtain additional insurance benefits; and

WHEREAS, the Assembly has considered the benefits of consolidation and finds that the proposal does not require circulation of a petition among the residents in the proposed area; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Manager analyzed and provided recommendations for the consolidation of the two fire service areas; and

WHEREAS, upon consolidation, the services to be provided in the service area will continue to be all things necessary and proper to provide fire protection; and

WHEREAS, a description of the geographic boundaries of the proposed consolidated fire service area are described in the attached ordinance, information memorandum, and maps of the area.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Assembly approves the proposal for consolidation of the properties in the Willow and Caswell fire service areas without the circulation of a petition among the residents in the proposed consolidation area.

SUMMARY STATEMENT:

The Willow Fire Service Area and Caswell Fire Service Area have been working together operationally as a single fire department for many years. During this time the department has operated under a common Fire Chief, shared staff support, and functioned largely

as one organization to maximize efficiency and effectiveness to their respective communities. During this time of collaboration the department has operated using a single pool of on-call responders with common operating procedures. Department responders already wear the same uniform with a common patch on their shoulder. This operationally combined department has responded to hundreds of emergency calls protecting their residents and endured some of the largest disasters in the Matanuska-Susitna Borough. Through the coordination and cooperative efforts of both Fire Service Area Boards, they have created an efficient and effective response team.

The Board of Supervisors of each Service Area now wishes to achieve a greater level of fire protection for their community by initiating a formal consolidation effort with the goal of merging these two service areas into one, the Willow-Caswell Fire Service Area. The Boards of both service areas, each by unanimous vote, have requested the Borough initiate the process to combine, or consolidate, the fire service areas by placing it on the ballot for their respective voters to decide.

Consolidating these two service areas will enhance fire protection even further to the residents and businesses of the community through a number of service improvements and enhanced efficiencies. As they already operate as one joint organization on a daily basis, they will continue to maximize available resources and personnel for emergency responses. Capital and operational planning will improve as a single capital and operating budget will be prepared and implemented for the new service area. By forming one service area the cumulative mil rate for a large portion of the new district will decrease significantly. Apparatus and facilities can be planned to maximize coverage for the entire community based on need. Other benefits will be realized by removing the duplication of administration and reducing overhead to a single entity eliminating duplicated efforts. The Department of Emergency Services supports this effort and believes it is consistent with the mission to provide the highest level of service available to the community in a cost efficient manner.

No boundary changes are being requested, this is solely a consolidation of the two existing service areas into one. Any parcel not currently in either the Willow Fire Service Area or Caswell Fire Service Area will not be included in the consolidated Willow-Caswell Fire Service Area.

- The total assessed value of taxable real property in the proposed unified area is \$630,570,050.
- The total value of taxable personal property in the proposed unified area is zero.
- The population of the proposed unified area is 2,138.
- The estimated cost of the proposed service for the first year is \$1,662,813, which is approximately 2.637 mills.

Should the Assembly approve the ordinance calling for the submission of the question to the voters, which is found in the ordinance, the vote will be scheduled for the upcoming regular Borough election to be held on November 5, 2024.

The voters in each service area would vote on the unification separately and the unification would need to pass in both service areas for the unification to move forward.

RECOMMENDATION OF ADMINISTRATION: Administration recommends placing the question of the unification of the Willow and Caswell fire service areas before the voters at the next regular Borough election to be held on November 5, 2024.

(B) *Services.* The services to be provided in this service area are all things necessary and proper to provide fire protection.

(C) *Board of Supervisors.* The Caswell Fire Service Area No. 135 Board of Supervisors shall consist of a three-member board that shall operate pursuant to MSB 5.15.010. The three-year term shall be calculated on a calendar year basis.
