Lynx Lake Road Update: At a recent budget hearing, the topic of improvements to Lynx Lake Road in RSA 20, Willow, was addressed. In the interest of managing expectations, this road is now included on the RSA 20 Road Improvement Projects (RIP) list approved by the Assembly in February 2025. However, it is the lowest-prioritized project and will not be targeted for design until after 2029. This is simply due to limited funding for the RSA, which is indicative of a number of RSAs, particularly in more rural areas with a limited tax base.

<u>Woody Debris at Transfer Sites</u>: The Talkeetna and Willow Transfer sites' soils are saturated and cannot accept traffic for woody debris drop-off. We are targeting Friday, May 9, to open those facilities for woody debris. These sites typically open on June 1, so we expect to be open for woody debris a few weeks before we usually accept this material at these sites.

# **Board of Equalization Appeals Weekly Update:**

  - Heard Last Week: 6 appeals (one appellant with several properties was rescheduled). MSB's value was upheld in all appeals, which included one commercial property.
