<u>Mat-Su Borough School District Update</u>: To correct an error in the legislative priorities provided at the Joint Assembly/School Board meeting on September 9, 2025, the District website has been updated and can be found here.

During the September 9 Joint Assembly/School Board meeting a member inquired if any of the Board's legislative priorities were connected to specific bills already sponsored. SB 143 – Municipal School Board Terms, was sponsored by Senator Yundt and relates to priority number three (Allow municipalities and boroughs the ability to align board member terms with other elected officials). SB 3 – Authorize Handguns School Employees/Volunteers was sponsored by Senator Hughes and relates to priority number seven. SB 5 – School/University Employee Health Insurance was sponsored by Senator Hughes and relates to priority number two.

Also, during the Joint Assembly/School Board meeting, a member inquired about class sizes. The budgeted pupil-teacher ratio targets for FY 2026 for regular education classrooms for all subject areas are listed below. Effective July 1, 2026, for FY 2027 the District will be required to adhere to a new section AS 14.03.065, which reads "Maximum classroom size. Each school district shall establish and make available to the public a target average class size policy for each grade level. The target average class size for pre-kindergarten through grade six may not exceed 23, and the target average class size for grades seven through 12 may not exceed 30. The policy may exclude missed grade classes and courses in art, library, music, computer science, vocational-technical, and physical education. The policy must include procedures to reduce class sizes when the school district determined a reduction is appropriate." The District will be evaluating their current class sizes and working with the policy committee to develop the policy required under this section.
