Is the material in good condition or appearance?

Willow Library Material Condition - Good condition

Is the topic of the material a priority for the collection?

Red Hood is shelved in the Young Adult (YA) sections at Willow Library. Young Adult collections are responsive and tend to reflect the age and stage of life of the intended reader. The book, Red Hood, is a twist on a classic fairy tale to address the issues of sexual abuse and harassment among women.

Is the format of the material a priority for the collection?

The material is a book format. Books make up the majority of inventory in all five of our public libraries.

Has the material been used frequently by patrons?

This factor depends on the library due to the collections size, the size of the library and length of time one patron maintains the book. Willow Library shelved the book in June 2020 and the book has been checked out 12 times. This is about a medium rate of check out for the YA collection in a library of Willow's size.

Is the material factually accurate?

This book is a work of fiction and not a resource material.

Has the material been superseded by a new edition or a better source?

N/A

Is the material relevant to the needs and interests of the community?

The University of Alaska Anchorage publishes an Alaska Victimization Survey and reports that 33.7% of Mat-Su women experience sexual violence in their lifetime.

Can the material be easily borrowed from another source?

It is available at all the Borough libraries through our participation in the State Library Catalog as well as an E-Book through the Alaska Digital Library.

What is the literary, artistic, scientific, political, or educational merit of the material.

This Young Adult book addresses the difficult issues of sexual violence and harassment from a minor's perspective with a female protagonist.

Does the material have positive review(s) in one or more appropriate professional journals?

Reviews are typically done in professional journals soon after the publication of the book. Staff could not find a record of a review in a professional journal without having to have a subscription to the journal.

There are many nonfiction books and resources available on the subjects of sexual abuse and harassment.

Does the material have a reputation and/or significance of the author, publisher or producer?

Nine of Arnold's books are Junior Library Guild selections; A Boy called Bat, Bat and the Waiting Game, Damsel, Bat at the End of Everything, The House That Wasn't There, Red Hood, Starla Jean and Just Harriet. In 2021, Publishers Weekly named Red Hood as one of the top ten young adult novels of the year

Has the Mat-Su Borough School District's (MSBSD) Library Citizen's Advisory Committee (LCAC) reviewed this material?

Yes, the MSBSD LCAC reviewed the book on April 11, 2024 and recommended the book be removed from the school library system. The totals for the vote included:

• Retain at all libraries: 0

• Remove from all school libraries: 6

• Retain only at high school libraries: 4

• Vote Pending: 1

Retain only at middle and high school

libraries: 0

The MSBSD Board voted to remand the book to the Administration for a decision. The Administration determined that the book "Red Hood" would return to high school libraries.
